The second event under F.E.T.S. banner was a one day hands-on workshop on PC-assembly which was conducted by our Head of EXTC department Dr. Y.S. Rao sir. It was conducted on Saturday, 28th August, 2010 from 10 am to 6 pm. Through the initial power-point presentation students were given an insight into the technology incorporated in the motherboards right from the days of the microprocessor 8085 to the advanced Pentium processors of today's times. Various versions of the same hardware were simultaneously shown to the students. This was followed by Rao sir teaching us Linux installation and CMOS setup. The rest of the day was dedicated to actually dissecting the PC which most students were looking forward to. Every group of 2 students was supposed to open the CPU and understand the various parts as they removed them and of course , put them back in the right place later! This was accompanied with their constant flow of questions and everywhere one could hear 'What is this part for?', 'Where is this to be connected? ;*all of which helped them to understand the computer not as a layman but as an engineer* . Linux installation was performed by the students in groups after the PC was assembled. Teacher's Day Celebrations:

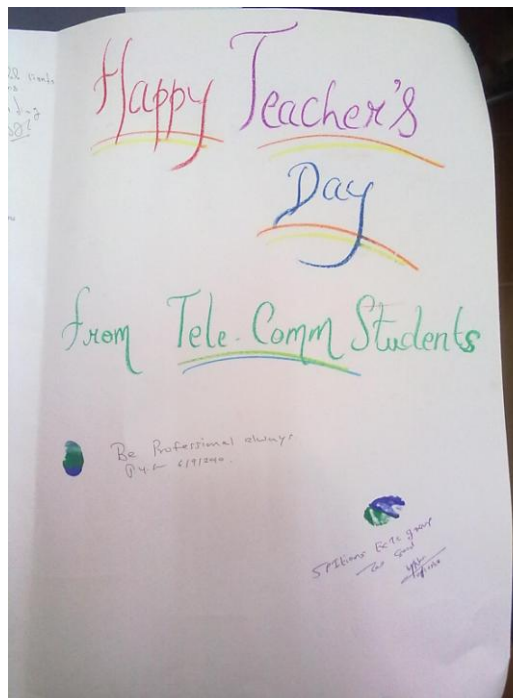
Date: 6th September,2010
